Program Overview

The **Community Development Program** aims to strengthen communities' capacity to identify their own needs, mobilize their resources and implement sustainable solutions. By placing populations at the heart of the development process, the program promotes empowerment, social inclusion and long-term community transformation.

Context and Vision

Externally imposed development often fails because it doesn't consider local realities, traditional knowledge and community aspirations. This program adopts a radically different approach: communities are the main actors of their development, supported by facilitators who strengthen their capacities rather than impose ready-made solutions.

Participatory Methodologies

Tools and Approaches Used

- **Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA):** Social mapping, seasonal calendar, transects
- **SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats):** Collective experience analysis
- **Problem tree:** Identification of root causes and effects
- **Participatory planning:** Collective development of community action plans
- **Theory of Change:** Mapping desired changes and pathways to achieve them
- **Focus Group Discussions:** In-depth exploration of perceptions and needs
- **Rapid Rural Appraisal (RRA):** Quick participatory information gathering
- **Photovoice:** Visual expression of community realities and aspirations

Program Objectives

- Strengthen leadership capacity of 200 community leaders
- Facilitate development of 40 community development plans
- Mobilize local and external resources for 100+ micro-projects
- Improve local governance and transparency in 40 communities

- Create spaces for intergenerational and inter-community dialogue
- Strengthen social cohesion and peaceful conflict resolution
- Promote inclusion of women, youth and marginalized groups
- Establish community monitoring-evaluation mechanisms

Community Development Cycle

1. Mobilization & Awareness

- Establishing contact with communities
- Presenting participatory approach
- Forming development committees
- Mapping local actors
- Creating dialogue spaces

2. Participatory Assessment

- Evaluating resources and constraints
- Identifying priority needs
- Analyzing social dynamics
- Mapping local knowledge
- Documenting aspirations

3. Collective Planning

- Defining community vision
- Prioritizing actions
- Developing action plans
- Identifying responsibilities
- Resource mobilization

4. Implementation & Monitoring

- Implementing micro-projects
- Technical support
- Participatory progress monitoring
- Learning by doing
- Adaptive adjustments

Inclusion and Social Equity

Priority Groups for Inclusion:

- **Women:** Participation in decisions, access to resources, leadership
- **Youth:** Expression spaces, economic opportunities, mentorship
- **People with disabilities:** Accessibility, full participation
- **Marginalized groups:** Fighting stigmatization, equitable access to services
- **Elderly people:** Valuing knowledge, advisory role

Quotas and specific mechanisms ensure representation of all.



Intervention Areas

Community Development Sectors

- **Community infrastructure:** Roads, bridges, schools, health centers, markets
- **Local economic development:** IGAs, cooperatives, market access, community tourism
- **Social services:** Education, health, social protection, water and sanitation
- **Environment and natural resources:** Forest management, conservation, renewable energy
- **Local governance:** Transparency, citizen participation, accountability
- **Culture and heritage:** Valuing traditions, community festivals
- **Social cohesion:** Conflict resolution, inter-community dialogue



Financing Approaches

Funding Sources

- Community contributions (labor, local materials)
- Community development funds
- Partnerships with local authorities
- NGO and donor support
- Community activity revenues

Transparent Management

- Democratically elected management committees
- Public accounts displayed
- Regular participatory audits
- Accessible complaint mechanisms
- Financial management training



Participatory Monitoring-Evaluation

- **Community-defined indicators:** Success measures according to their priorities
- **Community dashboards:** Visualization of progress accessible to all
- **Quarterly participatory reviews:** Collective reflection on achievements
- **Peer evaluation:** Exchanges between communities on good practices

- **Most Significant Change method:** Stories of individual and collective transformations
- **Outcome mapping:** Visualization of multidimensional changes

Capacity Building

Community Leader Training

- **Transformational leadership:** Vision, inspiration, change management
- **Participatory facilitation:** Group facilitation, conflict management
- **Strategic planning:** Long-term vision, SMART objectives
- **Project management:** Project cycle, budgets, reports
- **Resource mobilization:** Fundraising, partnerships, advocacy
- **Effective communication:** Active listening, negotiation, public speaking
- **Democratic governance:** Transparency, accountability, inclusion

Network Building

The program encourages network creation between communities to facilitate knowledge exchange, experience sharing and mutual solidarity. Exchange visits, inter-community forums and communication platforms enable communities to learn from each other and collaborate on common challenges.

Impact and Expected Changes

- **Empowerment:** Communities capable of managing their own development
- **Strengthened social cohesion:** Solidarity bonds, mutual support
- **Improved inclusion:** Active participation of women, youth, marginalized groups
- **Strengthened local governance:** Transparency, accountability, citizen participation
- **Mobilized local resources:** Valorization of community assets
- **Improved infrastructure and services:** Tangible and sustainable results
- **Increased resilience:** Capacity to face shocks and changes

- **Restored pride and dignity:** Recognition of capacities and achievements

Sustainability and Exit Strategy

The program integrates a sustainability strategy from the start: strengthening existing community structures, progressive transfer of responsibilities, creation of local financing mechanisms, and knowledge documentation. Support gradually withdraws as local capacities strengthen, ensuring a smooth transition to complete autonomy.
